## BPI-Philam Equity Index Fund 2 Market Commentary

The Philippine Stock Exchange Index (PSEi) displayed a roller coaster performance for the month following a slew of market moving events globally. The PSEi initially rose to as much as 2.4% before the news on Silicon Valley Bank (SVB) and Credit Suisse's collapse which sent shockwaves through the global financial system. The market also priced in the direction of the elevated interest rates and inflation. Meanwhile, on the local economic front, the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) raised policy rates by 25 basis points to 6.25% as Philippine Inflation remained high at 8.6%. In terms of inflation forecast, the BSP adjusted the 2023 and 2024 to 6.0% (from 6.1%) and 2.9% (from 3.1%), respectively. The local bourse gave up 0.9% to close at 6,499.68 in March.

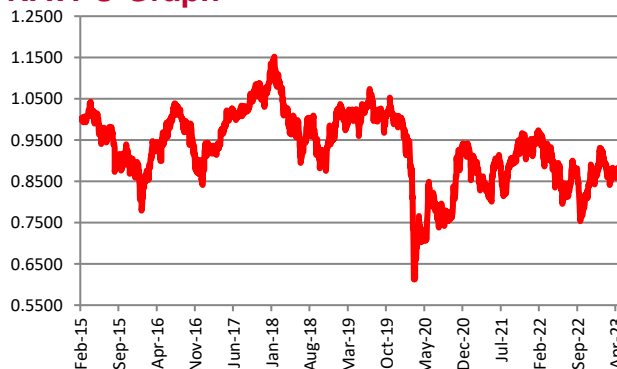
In terms of average daily turnover, the local bourse was less active for the month at US\$130.9 million or 10.6% lower compared to 146.4 million registered in February. Meanwhile, Foreigners remained net sellers with an outflow of US\$498 million, further stretching the Year-to-date figure to US\$518 million. Foreign participation clocked in at 47% (from 48%).

For the individual stock performances, the top three index gainers for the month are as follows: TEL (+10.51%), DMC (+8.90%) and SCC (+7.83%). Meanwhile, the bottom three index performers include: CNVRG (-21.28%), MONDE (-18.66%) and AEV (-10.37%).

## NAVPU Graph

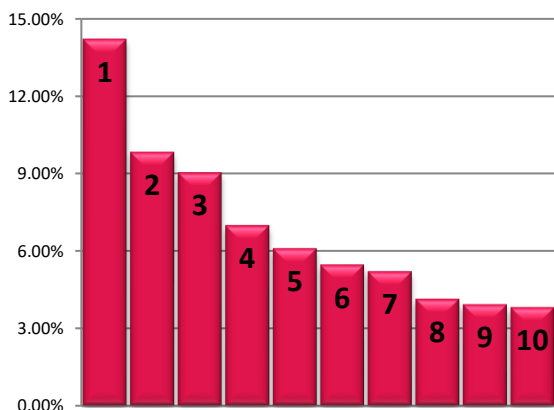
