BPI-Philam Odyssey Asia Pacific High Dividend Equity Fund Market Commentary

Asian equities ended the month in the green as returns across Asian markets were positive. China and Taiwan appreciated the most, while Thailand and Singapore appreciated the least. During the month, China recouped much of its losses from January as the Lunar New Year holidays were a surprise, with both credit and travel data beating expectations. The ongoing optimism around AI and positive quarterly results boosted the IT sector in Taiwan. Conversely, Thailand was affected by a drop in manufacturing activity and deflation. In Singapore, CPI fell amid lower services and food inflation.
